- TAC has helped lead a series of reforms to ITA governance, including the formation of a Governance Council tasked with conducting organizational reviews and changes to how WTC host cities are selected, and events organized.
- Under these new rules, TAC is planning to submit a bid for WTC 2026 to be hosted in Montreal.
- The next WTCs: 2022 Copenhagen, 2023 Athens, 2024 Shenzhen.
- The ITA continues to remain active with key initiatives like the Working Groups. TAC members are invited to get involved and should contact us if they are interested in being a TAC representative for a particular ITA Working Groups.



Engineering Institute of Canada

- TAC is a member society of the Engineering Institute of Canada (EIC). The EIC is a federation of 14 technical/engineering societies.
- As a member, TAC is eligible to nominate members for EIC awards and honours, such as Fellows of the EIC and the Julian C. Smith Medal and K.Y. Lo Medal recognizing significant engineering contributions to Canada and internationally, respectively.
- TAC's first nominee for the FEIC honour, Rick Lovat, was selected by the EIC for 2021.
- The EIC also participates in the Bacon and Eggheads breakfast talk series, which focusses on connecting Parliamentarians with experts in science and engineering.

Current 2021 Membership

As of October 1, 2021, total TAC membership included 385 individuals and firms broken down as follows (with a comparison to the figures at last year's AGM):

>	Individual Members	266 (288)	decrease of 22
>	Corporate Members	67 (59)	increase of 9
>	Student Members	37 (46)	decrease of 9
>	Retired Members	15 (11)	increase of 4

In 2020, total membership was 404 – our current count of 385 represents less than a 5% year over year decrease. This is a smaller decrease than occurred from 2019 to 2020, suggesting that the impacts of COVID-19 on membership have likely run their course.

Like TAC experienced in 2020, it is encouraging to see Corporate membership continuing to increase – a 15% growth over last year's number.



In 2022, the goal is to increase membership to over 450 individuals and firms, which will return the count to slightly below the December 2019 figure:

>	Individual members	300
>	Corporate members	70
>	Student members	70
>	Retired members	15

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors of the Tunnelling Association of Canada / Association Canadienne Des Tunnels

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Tunnelling Association of Canada / Association Canadienne Des Tunnels (the Organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2020, and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Organization as at December 31, 2020, and the results of its operations and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Accounting Standards for Not-for-profit Organizations (ASNPO).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Organization in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in Canada, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with ASNPO, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the Organization's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going-concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the Organization or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Organization's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report hat includes our opinion. SECTION 5 – DIRECTORS 5.01 Election and Term

Subject to the articles, *the members will elect the directors* at the first meeting of members and at each succeeding annual meeting at which an election of directors is required, and the *directors shall be elected to hold office for a term* beginning *January 1 of the year* following the annual general meeting following the election; and expiring on *January 1 of the year following the third annual meeting* of members following the election.

Terms of Directors shall be staggered to provide continuity on the Board of Directors.

Nominees for other Director positions shall be selected by majority vote of the Directors.
